GENERAL COMMITTEE 28TH ANNUAL GENERAL
MEETING (AGM) HELD ON SUNDAY, AUGUST 25,
2024 VIA ZOOM VIDEOCONFERENCE

OPENING

MUSICAL INTERLUDE

OPENING PRAYER

Mr. Bright Aboagye Obeng, the Campus Ministry Director and moderator for the meeting, opened the 28th Annual General Meeting (AGM) at 3:00 PM and welcomed all members. Mr. Paul Essah led the opening prayer. Mr. Bright Aboagye Obeng then introduced his co-moderator, Rev. Victor Yeboah Gyabaah, the Zonal Ministry Coordinator for the South West Zone.

EXHORTATION

Mr. Kwesi Amanor, a member of the GHAFES Board, delivered an exhortation based on Mark 16:15, emphasizing the responsibility of all believers to make disciples and impact their communities. He explained that our communities include not only our places of work but also the workshops we attend and our various spheres of influence. Mr. Amanor encouraged members to continue the work that the Lord Jesus began on earth. He concluded by praying for grace to empower others and to make disciples.

ROLL CALL/ ATTENDANCE

The 28th General Committee meeting was attended by 338 stakeholders, comprising the Board Members, Students, Associates, Staff, and Partner Organizations. The list of attendees at the 28th AGM is attached to this minutes.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The Board Chairman, Ing. Kwame Kpekpena, led the meeting through the agenda for the 28th Annual General Meeting (AGM). He informed members of the introduction of a new agenda item, Announcements. Mr. Paul Essah moved for the adoption of the agenda, which was seconded by Prof. Kafui Etsey.

CONSIDERATION AND ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

The Moderator, Mr. Bright Aboagye Obeng, guided members through the minutes of the 27th General Committee Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on Sunday, August 27, 2023. In the absence of any corrections, Rev. Victor Gyabaah Yeboah moved for the acceptance of the minutes, and this was seconded by Mr. Moses K. Annan.

REPORTS

REPORT BY THE BOARD CHAIRMAN

Mrs. Francisca Ahwireng, the Vice Board Chair, presented the Board Chairman's report for the period of January 2023 to December

2023, reflecting on the past year's challenges and successes. She expressed gratitude to the Board, various committees, and staff for their dedication and support.

BOARD EXITS

She informed members that during the year under review, the Board saw the exit of Mr. Richard Hammond Jr. (SNEC Chairman), who had successfully completed his one-year tenure of service.

NEW BOARD MEMBERS

She further stated that the Board unanimously approved the appointment of Prof. Edward Baagyere as a Board member during the third-quarter Board meeting. The Board also welcomed Ms. Andrea Owusu-Achaw (SNEC Chairperson) and Ms. Georgina Koomson (SNEC Secretary), who was reappointed for a second term as SNEC Secretary.

MAJOR BOARD RESOLUTIONS

During the year under review, several significant Board resolutions were made to shape and guide the governance and operations of the Fellowship. The most noteworthy of these resolutions were as follows. The Board approved:

- the Document Retention and Destruction Policy.
- the second tenure of office for the National Director, Mr. Isaac Mensah-Newton.
- GHS 620,000.00 to fund the Building Project.
- the Procurement, Disposal of Stores, and Vehicle Handling and Driving policies.
- Prof. Edward Y. Baagyere's appointment as a member of the GHAFES Board.

THE BOARD AND STAFF ANNUAL RETREAT

Mrs. Francisca Ahwireng reported that the annual Board and staff retreat plays a vital strategic role in fostering opportunities to align goals, promote collaboration, and enhance organizational effectiveness. She shared that the retreat, themed “Thriving Together: Keeping Watch Over Ourselves” (Acts 20:28), was held from Thursday, March 9 to Sunday, March 12, 2023, at the SMA Retreat Centre, Accra.

The retreat provided a valuable opportunity for the Board and staff to gather outside their usual meeting environment, deepening relationships between Board members and staff, uniting around the 5-Year Strategic Plan, and addressing critical issues that enhance the holistic partnership in the Lord’s vineyard, among other key objectives.

GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP AND ALLIANCE

The Vice-Chair affirmed that the Fellowship remains steadfast and committed to collaborating with diverse stakeholders and harnessing collective strengths and resources. She reported the following global partnership and alliance initiatives pursued during the period under review:

- The GHAFES Secretariat provided logistical support, including sourcing, identifying, and pre-financing flights for EPSA Regional staff and other National Movements within the region.
- Our partnership with SMD-Germany and other organizations resulted in 1,250 students becoming followers of Jesus Christ during the university mission held at the University of Ghana.
- The National Director actively participated in all engagements with the General Secretaries of IFES-EPSA, among other initiatives.

STAFFING

Mrs. Francisca Ahwireng reported that throughout the year, the Fellowship maintained a staff strength of sixty-seven (67), comprising 22 paid staff, 33 associate staff, and 12 missionary staff serving in the Short-Term Involvement in Community Service (STICS) project. She added that the ministry remains committed to supporting its staff by providing the necessary resources and assistance to help them thrive.

BOARD COMMITTEES

The Vice Board Chair expressed her appreciation to the following committees for their tremendous work and dedication to the ministry during the year under review:

- Finance Committee
- T.B. Dankwa Memorial Lecture Committee
- Governance and HR Committee
- Building Project Committee
- History Project Committee
- National Associates Ministry Reform Committee

She reaffirmed the Board’s commitment to working together to meet the ministry’s demands.

FINANCES

Mrs. Francisca Ahwireng expressed her appreciation to the Finance Committee, staff, and volunteers who helped the ministry manage its finances during the year under review. She called on Associates, both locally and abroad, as well as churches and organizations, to include the ministry in their budgets.

She concluded by encouraging members with Philippians 3:13-14, urging them to press forward toward what lies ahead and remain faithful stewards of God’s grace in its various forms. She also expressed the Board’s sincere appreciation to all stakeholders for their involvement and support of GHAFES.

REPORT OF THE NATIONAL DIRECTOR

Mr. Isaac Mensah-Newton, the National Director, presented his report for the year under review. He reported that by God's grace, 88,362 students were exposed to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, with 2,524 of them accepting the Lord Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord. The Fellowship's work among 13 indigenous communities through the Students in Church Evangelism and Students in Community Service (STICS) gave students opportunities to lead 3,439 people to Christ, out of 18,713 people reached with the Good News of Jesus Christ. The report further revealed that 434 students were trained to lead small group discipleship, and 1,423 were equipped to engage with Scripture. Further, 2,065 students were raised to be Christlike leaders of character, competence, and care both in their private and public lives for the family, church and marketplace. 1,293 fresh students were engaged in the FRESH Initiative to help them integrate into the University, and 20 students are currently involved in the Political Network of GHAFES Leadership Network (GHALNETS).

The ND's report further highlighted the following:

- 5360 students were mobilized and equipped for prayer engagements
- 1000 copies of Building a Strong Christlike and Discipleship Family System were printed and distributed to Local Campus Fellowships (LCFs) in the South East and the South West Zones
- 106 Associates signed up as mentors to mentor GHAFES students
- 478 final-year students were engaged and prepared for life beyond campus.
- 527 Associates attended Associates' Fellowship Meetings across the four zones.
- 130 Associates served as resource persons at the local, zonal, and national levels
- GHAFES was sustained by God through the support of 782 donors. This is made up of 761 local partners and 21 Associates who live in the diaspora.

In conclusion, the National Director expressed his appreciation to the GHAFES Board for their selfless commitment and dedication to the ministry. He further expressed gratitude to all stakeholders for their constant prayers, personal involvement, and financial support towards the ministry.

SNEC CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The immediate past SNEC Chairperson, Ms. Andrea Owusu-Achaw, presented her report for and on behalf of the Students' National Executive Committee for the 2023/2024 spiritual and academic year. She expressed her appreciation to all staff for their tireless contributions to the student ministry in the year under review. In her speech, she mentioned that all LCFs were given the assignment to carry out strategies and tasks aligned with the Campus Ministry Work Plan, which was divided into strategic priority areas. The SNEC Chairperson's report was centered on; Thriving in Witness, Thriving in Whole-Life Discipleship, Thriving in Leadership Development and Mentorship, and Thriving on New Grounds and Strengthening Weak LCFs.

On behalf of the SNEC, the Chairman made the following recommendations:

- Before assuming positions, LCF leaders should be encouraged to focus on their personal growth and development.
- More staff should be employed to improve the staff fellowship ratio.
- LCF leaders should be educated on the nature of the fellowship and how to co-exist with other denominations on the campuses in a way that benefits both sides.
- LCFs must be better supervised in the way funds and fellowship assets are managed.

In conclusion, the SNEC Chairperson thanked all stakeholders for their support and guidance during the 2023/2024 spiritual and academic year.

EXTERNAL AUDITOR'S REPORT

Mr. Francis Nomo, on behalf of Intellisys Chartered Accountant Limited, presented the independent Auditor's report for the year ended December 2023.

AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR 2023

The Senior Treasurer, Mr. Yaw Appiah Lartey presented the financial report for the year ended 2023. Below are highlights of his report:

- Revenue (income) is mainly generated through donations from Local Associates, Partners, Churches and Organizations.
- Income increased by 48% in 2023.
- Foreign donations increased by 13.5%
- Investment income increased by 12.3%
- Expenses increased from GHS 1.5 million in the previous year to GHS 2 million in 2023.
- Staff Cost increased by 29% due to salary increases and corresponding statutory obligations

The Senior Treasurer thanked Associates, both local and foreign donors, Churches and other partners for their immense support towards the ministry.

DISCUSSION AND ADOPTION OF THE REPORTS

Mr. Paul Essah commended the team for their outstanding work during the year under review. He inquired about the progress made in relation to the 5-Year Strategic Plan. The National Director responded that the first two years of the plan focused on establishing the five enablers.

Prof. Kafui Etsey asked how the figure of 527 Associates attending the Associates' Meetings was determined. The National Director explained that monthly reports are collected from the Zones on all Associate activities, and an average attendance figure is calculated and recorded.

Mr. Samuel Avaala inquired about the reasons behind the increase in cash inflows from Churches and Organizations in 2023, questioning whether this increase was a one-time occurrence or part of a trend. He also recommended finding ways to discuss and collaborate with churches to address issues of denominationalism. Mr. Isaac Frempong Boakye, the Finance Manager, explained that proposals were sent to these churches, and prayerful efforts contributed to the increase in donations. The National Director added that Associates in these churches also advocated for donations. He encouraged Associates who can engage their churches to assist with this effort.

With no further discussions on the reports, Mr. Boison Agmosi Angmortey moved to adopt the reports, and the motion was seconded by Mr. Moses Kwesi Annan.

PRESENTATION ON THE 5-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN

The co-moderator, Rev. Victor Gyabaah Yeboah, informed the meeting that, in accordance with the demands of the 5-Year Strategic Plan, an Associate Ministry Structure and framework should be established by the end of the third year of the Plan. He reported that a National Team was set up to study and survey the Associates Ministry, and a framework and structure for the Associate Ministry have been submitted to the Board and are awaiting implementation.

Regarding Strategy 2, Rev. Yeboah stated that new Associate Fellowships have been initiated. He highlighted that the New Associates Partnership Club (NAPC), which aims to cultivate the habit of giving among young Associates, is operational. The NAPC seeks to ensure that at least 50% of graduates are ushered into and engaged at the Associate level.

He concluded by noting that Associate meetings are held in Kumasi, Takoradi, Accra, Tamale, and Sunyani. Looking ahead, he mentioned plans to expand the Students in Community Service (STICS) program to include not only teachers but also other professions.

AFFILIATIONS

The Vice Board Chair led the process for affiliating four Local Campus Fellowships whose constitutions and doctrinal bases align with GHAFES' objectives. The schools involved were:

- Accra College of Medicine - Christian Medical Fellowship
- Gambaga College of Education
- Allied Health Christian Medical Fellowship
- GHAFES UMaT School of Railway and Infrastructure Development, Asikado

Rev. Victor Gyabaah Yeboah moved for the acceptance of these fellowships as GHAFES Local Campus Fellowships, and the motion was seconded by Ms. Judith Fosu Gyau.

APPOINTMENT OF AN AUDITOR FOR 2024

The Board Chairman, Mr. Kpekpena, referenced Section 139, Subsection 11 of the Companies Act, which stipulates that an Auditor may hold office for no more than six years and must undergo a cooling-off period of at least six years. He noted that Intellysis has served as the Ministry's auditor for a maximum six-year years. After consulting with six audit firms, the Board has proposed Baker Tilly Andah & Andah as the new auditors for the Ministry.

Mr. Victor Obeng moved for the acceptance of Baker Tilly Andah & Andah as the Ministry's auditors, and the motion was seconded by Mr. Emmanuel Ntow.

AYEKOO TO OUTGOING BOARD MEMBERS

The Board Chair, Mr. Kwame Kpekpena, informed that several Board Members will be stepping down as they have completed their terms according to the provisions of the constitution. The members stepping down are:

Mr. Paul Essah moved for the acceptance of the ratification of the appointment of the new board members, and the motion was seconded by Ms. Believe Esi Tay.

FRATERNAL GREETINGS FROM THE GHANA EVANGELISM COMMITTEE AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF OTHER PARTNERS

Apostle Bright Nyamedor, the National Director of the Ghana Evangelism Committee (GEC), extended fraternal greetings. He explained that the GEC is an indigenous interdenominational service agency with a mission to facilitate soul-winning and disciple souls to live and walk in holiness.

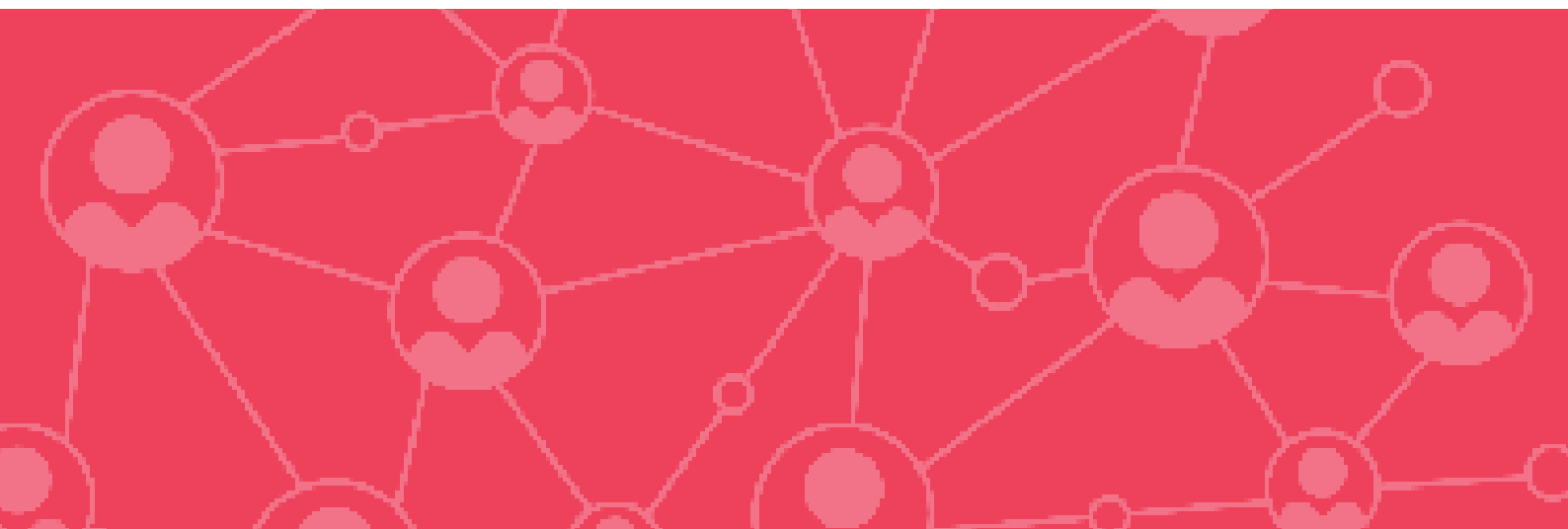
Apostle Nyamedor updated members on the upcoming 3rd National Church Survey, which aims to assess the Church's growth, opportunities, and challenges. The Moderator, Mr. Bright Aboagye Obeng, announced the following upcoming programs:


- The Students in Church Evangelism (SICE) outreach is ongoing with an orientation at the University of Ghana. He requested the prayers of all for a successful SICE.

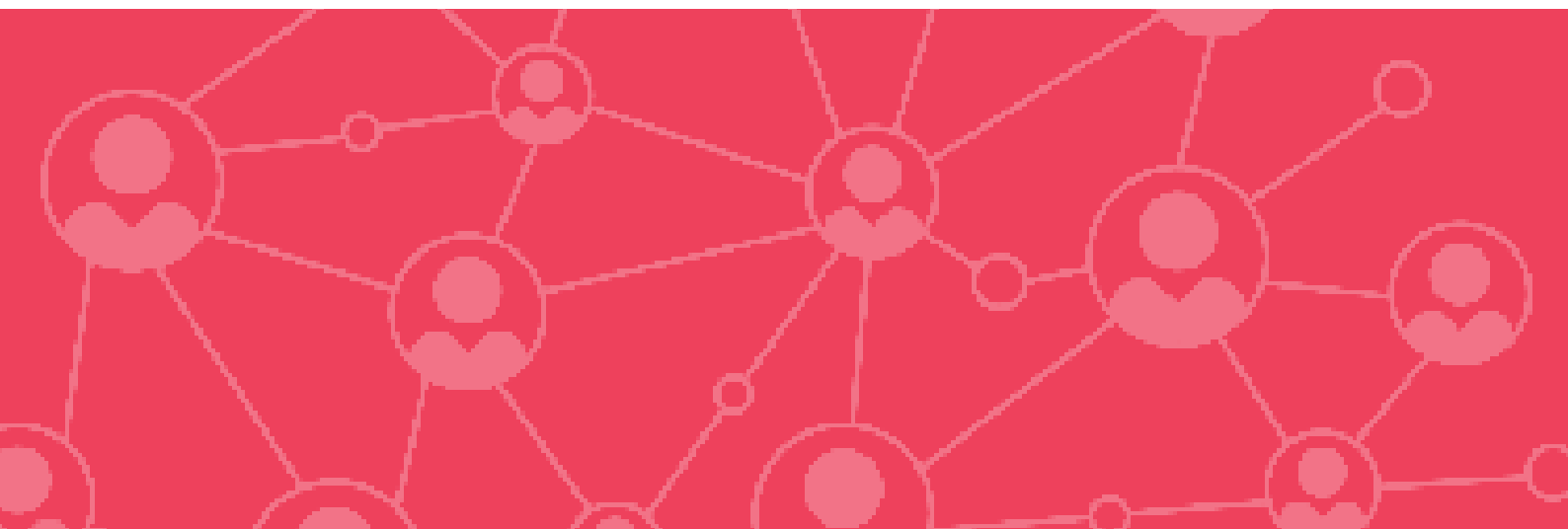
