



# GENERAL COMMITTEE 26TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM) HELD ON SUNDAY, AUGUST 21, 2022 VIA ZOOM VIDEOCONFERENCE

### **OPENING**

Rev. Victor Yeboah Gyabaah, the Staff Representative on the Governing Board and moderator for the meeting, opened the 26th Annual General Meeting (AGM) at 3:00pm and said the opening prayer.

## ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Ing. Kwame Kpekpena, the Board Chairman, led the meeting through the agenda for the 26th AGM. Prof. Kafui Etsey, an Associate, moved for the adoption of the agenda and this was seconded by Mr. Kwesi Annan, a student.

# CONSIDERATION AND ADOPTION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

Rev. Victor Yeboah Gyabaah led the meeting through the minutes of the 25th General Committee Annual General Meeting (AGM) dated Sunday, August 22, 2021. In the absence of any correction, Rev. Jedidiah Azumah, an Associate moved for the acceptance of the minutes and this was seconded by Rev. Dr. Timothy Crentsil, an Associate.

#### **REPORTS**

# REPORT BY THE BOARD CHAIRMAN

Mrs. Francisca Ahwireng, the Board Vice Chair, read the Board Chairman's report. She reported that the Board continues to exercise its governance functions, overseeing management and formulating and monitoring implementation of strategy and policies.

She indicated that in line with the provisions of the Board's governing documents, the Board saw the exit of Mr. Emmanuel Asiamah (SNEC Chairman) and Ms. Angelina Kantam (SNEC Secretary) after successfully completing their one-year tenure and Mr. Alfred Mahami (SNEC Chairman) and together with his secretary, Mr. Benedict Apenteng, as new entrants to the Board.

The highlights of the Chairman's report included the following:

- The Board appointed Mr. Bright Aboagye
   Obeng as the Campus Ministry Director.
- The search for a full time Associate
   Ministry Director was unsuccessful.
   However, the Board appointed Mrs. Gloria
   Etwire as a volunteer staff to assist the
   National Director with Associate Ministry
   work.
- The Board approved three (3) policy documents – the Human Resource (HR) Manual, the Financial Management Policy, and the Local Campus Fellowship (LCF) Membership Policy.
- The Board, during the fourth quarter meeting held on December 11, 2021, resolved to appoint a law firm to review, update, and align GHAFES governing documents.

The Vice Chair also shared other highlights as follows:

- The International Fellowship of Evangelical Students (IFES) serves as a resource conduit for Associates and friends of GHAFES in the diaspora to directly support (financially) the student ministry in Ghana.
- Staff of GHAFES received online training opportunities and theological training through the Institute of Staff Development Training programme organized by English and Portuguese Speaking Africa (EPSA) and in partnership with the JOS ECWA Theological Seminary (JETS) in Jos, Nigeria. Last year, two staff Mr. Bright

Aboagye Obeng and Mr. Anthony Kabah, successfully completed their programme.

- Board members were privileged to participate in the IFES Governance refresher training, dubbed Matt.25 eFORUM training, to empower Board members to support, mobilise, and inspire their respective national movements.
- The GHAFES House building is still under construction. With the generous financial gifts from associates and friends, the ground floor is completed.
- In the year under review, the Lord blessed the ministry with many generous stakeholders who supported the ministry financially to see students transformed by Gospel.

In her closing statement, and on behalf of the Board, she thanked the Associates for their unflinching support and generosity over the years. She also expressed gratitude to God for the indefatigable staff, patrons and students for availing themselves to be agents of change on the campuses and beyond.

# REPORT OF THE NATIONAL DIRECTOR

The National Director (ND), Mr. Isaac Mensah-Newton, reported that through dynamic and creative student-led initiatives, 40,086 students were exposed to the Good News of Jesus Christ with 1,777 of them becoming followers of Jesus Christ. The Fellowship's work among indigenous communities gave students opportunities to lead 810 people to Christ, out of 3,346 people reached with the Good News of Jesus Christ. The report further revealed that 3,854 tertiary students were involved in active small-group discipleship.

1,446 local Campus Fellowship executives were equipped and empowered to be leaders of character, competence, and care-both in their private and public lives for the family, the church, market place.

The ND's report further highlighted the following:

- 1,296 final-year students were engaged and prepared for life beyond campus.
- 326 Associates attended Associates'
   Fellowship Meetings across the four zones.
- Over 300 students participated in last year's
  Issacharism Conference (a Christian and
  social-engagement conference and under
  the theme, "Caretakers; Enforcing God's
  Plan in a Broken World.") empowering
  students to seek God on what they can
  do in His world with clarity of purpose.
- The 2021 T. B. Dankwa Missions Fund and Public Lecture saw the participation of 240 stakeholders with over three thousand (3,000) viewers on Facebook and YouTube.
- GHAFES was sustained by God through the support of 854 donors. This was made up of 835 local partners and 19 Associates who live in the diaspora.
- The 5-year strategic plan was near completion.

In conclusion, the National Director thanked the GHAFES Board for their selfless commitment and dedication to the ministry. He further expressed gratitude to all stakeholders for their constant prayers, personal involvement, and financial support towards the ministry.

# EXTERNAL AUDITOR'S REPORT

Mrs. Abigail Frimpong, on behalf of Intellisys Chartered Accountants Ltd., presented the Independent Auditors report for the year ended December 2021.

## AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR 2021

The Senior Treasurer, Mr. Yaw Appiah Lartey, presented the financial report for the year ended 2021. Below were highlights of his report:

- Revenue (income) is mainly generated through donations from 'Local Associates and Friends'. Revenue increased by 11.8% from GHS1,017,257 in 2020 to GHS1,137,320.
- Foreign donations declined by 26.6% as a result of a grant of \$10,000 received from a Foundation in 2020. There was no such receipt in 2021.
- Income from programmes increased from approximately GHS43,000 to GHS177,000 in 2021.
- Students in Church Evangelism (SICE), which accounts for about 67.9% of the total income from programmes for the year 2021, increased by 367.3% mainly due to a donation of GHS 100,000 received from an associate.
- Staff costs increased by 13.5%.
- Investments mainly consist of mutual funds and treasury bills. Investment doubled over the period mainly from additional investments in mutual funds and treasury bills.

The Senior Treasurer thanked Associates and other partners for their immense support towards the ministry.

#### SNEC CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The immediate past SNEC Chairman, Mr. Alfred Mahami presented his report for and on behalf of the Students' National Executive Committee for the 2021/2022 spiritual/ academic year, with emphasis on students' involvement in Campus Evangelism and Missions, Scripture Engagement, Small Group Discipleship, Leadership Development and Mentorship and Campus Engagement.

# DISCUSSION AND ADOPTION OF THE REPORTS

Mr. Nana Yaw Opoku Gyamfi inquired why the number of students recorded to have observed their daily quiet time was higher in some zones and lower in others. In response, the SNEC Chairman said the report focused on students who were consistent with their daily quiet time. There were others who observed their quiet time but were not consistent in doing so.

Rev. Jedidiah Azumah wanted clarification on what constitute SNEC quota. Rev. Victor Gyabaah responded that the SNEC quota is a decision by SNEC to contribute 15% of the LCF's regular income to support the national budget.

In the absence of further discussions on the reports, Rev. Dr. James Yamoah moved for the adoption of the reports and this was seconded by Rev. Azumah.

## APPOINTMENT OF AN AUDITOR

Dr. Mrs. Edna Okorley, an Associate, moved to maintain Intellysis Chartered Accountants Limited as external auditors for the 2022 accounts. The motion was seconded by Rev. Dr. James Yamoah. The AGM unanimously approved the re-appointment of Intellysis Chartered Accountants Limited as external auditors for the year 2022.

### APPOINTMENT/ PRESENTATION OF NEW BOARD MEMBERS

The Board Chairman informed the meeting that the Board, as part of ensuring the right mix of members on the Board and to ensure continuity, developed Board Replacement Plan. To this end, the Board nominated two candidates, Lawyer Mrs. Grace Osei-Hwere and Mrs. Amma Asamoabea Eleblu and presented to the 26th AGM for appointment to the Board.

Rev. Dr. Timothy Crentsil moved for the affirmation of the two candidates as Board members and this was seconded by Mr. Bernard.

The Chairman further introduced to the AGM the students' representatives - Mr. Richard Hammond (SNEC Chairman) and Ms. Georgina Koomson (SNEC Secretary) on the Board. He then added that by reason of the Fellowship's Constitution, they are automatically joining the Board once elected as SNEC Chair and Secretary.

### PRESENTATION OF PLAQUES TO THE OUTGONE SNEC CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY

The Board's Vice Chair, Mrs. Francisca Ahwireng, acknowledged and presented plaques to Mr. Emmanuel Asiamah, former SNEC chairman and Ms. Angelina Kantam, former SNEC secretary for their outstanding dedication and commitment to the ministry of GHAFES.

# AFFILIATION OF THREE (3) LOCAL CAMPUS FELLOWSHIPS (LCFS) TO GHAFES

The National Director presented these three (3) fellowships for affiliation:

- 1. The Ghana Law School Christian Fellowship (LCF)
- 2. Ghana Fellowship of Evangelical Students (GHAFES) Kumasi Technical University
- 3. Physician Assistantship Students Association of Ghana Christian Fellowship (PASAG-CF)

The AGM unanimously accepted the affiliation of the above-named fellowships to GHAFES. The Board Chairman welcomed and congratulated the representatives of the three fellowships.

# FRATERNAL GREETINGS FROM GREAT COMMISSION MOVEMENT OF GHANA (GCMG) AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF OTHER PARTNERS

Mr. Kumah Doe, the National Director of GCMG gave the fraternal greeting. He shared that the urgency of the Great Commission is more demanding today than it has ever been. He alluded that GHAFES has been at the forefront of helping mould the character and behavior of students contributing to the spiritual, physical and human development of the country in many ways. He further added that no single person, organisation or church can fulfil the Great Commission alone, hence, the need for partnerships. In his concluding statement, he prayed that the Lord would help GHAFES and the network of its partners in scaling up to help bring the needed personal, societal and national transformation.
