




We encourage you to participate fully, listen attentively, and respond obediently to God's call.



## Apostle JFK Mensah Main Expositor

JFK Mensah is a seasoned Christian minister with over forty years of experience, widely recognised in Ghana and internationally for his emphasis on holiness, Christlikeness, and discipleship. He ministers across churches, fellowships, educational institutions, and interdenominational platforms, and is a respected voice mentoring pastors and Christian leaders from diverse backgrounds.

He has a distinct grace for youth ministry, having spoken extensively in secondary schools, universities, and tertiary institutions across Ghana, including major public and private universities. Internationally, he ministers across North America, Europe, Asia, and Australia, and is actively involved in missions as an advisor, board member, and mentor with several mission organisations, particularly focusing on the Unfinished Task in North and West Africa.

JFK Mensah is the Founder of the Christlike Disciplemakers Movement and Rector of its accredited Bible School, which trains disciples and missionaries through Certificate and Diploma programmes in Missions and Discipleship. In 2022, the Movement became a sending organisation, deploying 23 missionaries to unreached peoples in Ghana and Nigeria in pursuit of the Great Commission.



## Professor (Mrs.) Ibok Nsa Oduro

### Plenary Speaker

Professor (Mrs.) Ibok Nsa Oduro is a trailblazing scholar, exceptional mentor, and one of Ghana's most inspiring champions for women in science and leadership. A Professor of Food Science and Technology at KNUST, she holds degrees from the University of Ibadan and earned her Ph.D. from Cranfield University in the UK as a Chevening Scholar.

Prof. Mrs Oduro has served KNUST with distinction — from Head of Department to Vice Dean, Dean, and notably as the first female Provost of the College of Science, breaking new ground for women in academia.

A passionate advocate for talent development, she has mentored hundreds of students and currently leads as President of WiSTEM Ghana. She is also the Founder of the Ibok Oduro Foundation, advancing STEM education and leadership among young women. She is currently the Vice Dean and Dean of Biosciences and the Vice Dean of Students at KNUST.



## Dr. Yaw Perbi

### Plenary Speaker

Dr. Yaw Perbi is a physician, pastor and principal at Perbi Executive Leadership (PELÉ). His coaching clients include government and military leaders, media, multilateral and multinational executives worldwide. For eight years, he was CEO & President of a Canadian non-profit in the international education space. Yaw is the founder and Global CEO of The HuD Group, championing holistic emerging leadership development in 25 countries on all continents over the last two decades.

As a medical doctor, he has practised medicine in both his home country, Ghana, and as a military captain with the United Nations in Cote d'Ivoire. Dr. Perbi's two dozen books include *YouthPower!*, Amazon bestseller *Thinking Outside The Window*, *Africa to the Rest*, and *Disciple Ship*. He's physically served in over 60 countries and been the toast of media groups worldwide including CNN, the National Press Club (Washington DC), VOA, CBC and BBC.

Dr. Yaw Perbi is John Maxwell-certified and holds an advanced degree in global leadership. He is a Fellow of the African Leadership Initiative and the Aspen Global Leadership, International Director of Kwiverr, and a Lausanne Movement catalyst. Yaw and his economist-entrepreneur wife co-founded Perbi Cubs, an EdTech contributing to eradicating learning poverty. Together with their seven delightful children, they make their home between Montreal, Canada and Accra, Ghana, describing themselves as transnationals.



## Professor Dela Adadevoh

### Plenary Speaker

Professor Delanyo Adadevoh is a highly respected missionary, transformational leader, and champion for raising leaders of integrity across Africa and beyond. He holds a Ph.D. in Interpretation Theory from the University of Leeds and has served with Campus Crusade for Christ International for over four decades in key leadership roles across Africa, the Middle East, and Central Asia. He currently serves as Vice President for Global Leadership, shaping leaders in more than 100 nations.

Prof. Adadevoh is the Founder and President of the International Leadership Foundation (ILF) and Chairman of the African Forum on Religion and Government (AFReG). A visionary thinker and inspiring speaker, he is the author of several influential books, including *Transforming Leadership* and *I See a New Africa*. He is also a devoted husband and father of three, embodying leadership marked by integrity, impact, and hope.



## Dr. Mudasiru Yusuf

### Plenary Speaker

Mudasiru Yusuf committed his life to Jesus Christ as a teenager and soon developed a growing desire to share the message of Christ with others. This passion led him to join Campus Crusade for Christ during his university years, where he led the student movement on his campus for three years.

After earning his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree in 2004, Mudasiru answered God's call to full-time ministry and joined Campus Crusade for Christ in Nigeria. Over the years, he has served in various leadership roles, including Local Team Leader, National SLM Leader for Nigeria, and Area SLM Leader for West Africa.

Currently, he serves as the Regional Leader for the Student-Led Movement (SLM) across Africa, providing vision, leadership, and direction to student ministries throughout the continent. Mudasiru also holds an M.A. in Organizational Leadership from the Global Academy for Transformational Leadership (GATL), a Master of Divinity in Muslim Studies from Columbia International University (CIU) in South Carolina, USA, and is presently pursuing a PhD in Intercultural Studies at CIU.

He lives in Abuja, Nigeria, with his wife, Sarah, their adopted daughter, and three biological sons.




## Rt. Rev. Dr. Nii Mai Ollenu Plenary Speaker

The Rt. Rev. Dr. Samuel Nii Nmaii Ollenu is the Bishop of the Accra Diocese of The Methodist Church Ghana, elected in 2024. An ordained minister and seasoned leader, he carries a deep pastoral burden for discipleship, spiritual formation, and the holistic transformation of God's people.

He is a former Head of the West African Examinations Council (WAEC), Ghana National Office, and holds a Ph.D. in Business Administration.

Rt. Rev. Dr. Ollenu brings a unique blend of faith, wisdom, and administrative experience to his ministry, engaging issues of community development, ethical leadership, and national life. His episcopal ministry reflects a shepherd's heart, grounded in service, integrity, and the gospel of Jesus Christ.



## Ps. Gary Hogans Speaker

Pastor Gary is an American pastor and native of Los Angeles, California, USA, who serves as the National Director of Black Scholars and Professionals (BSAP) with InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, USA. In this role, he provides pastoral and spiritual oversight for Black faculty and graduate students across American universities, with particular focus on Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and the formation of Christian intellectual leadership.

A committed missional thinker with a Pan-African vision, Pastor Gary is engaged in global Christian scholarship through the Lausanne Movement, including participation in the Fourth Lausanne Congress on World Evangelization (Incheon-Seoul), service with the Freedom and Justice Network, and ongoing contribution to the Academic Ministry and Education Network (AMEN).

His deep affection for Ghana was strengthened through his participation in the GHAFES SMAC Conference (2022). He has served as Assistant Pastor at Calvary Chapel Crenshaw, Los Angeles, for over 35 years and holds a Bachelor's degree in Finance from California State University, Long Beach, an MBA from Pepperdine University, and an MA in Theology and Mission (World Christianity) from the Akrofi-Christaller Institute, Ghana. He has been married to his wife, Gwendolyn, for 43 years and is blessed with two adult children, four grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.



## Ps. Gwendolyn Hogans Speaker

Gwendolyn (Gwen) Hogans is the wife of Pastor Gary Hogans and the mother of two children, Marshawn and Kristine. She is also a grandmother of four and a proud great-grandmother of one. Gwen is a licensed minister with Love & Order Christian Fellowship and a member of Calvary Chapel Crenshaw (CCC) in Southern California, where she currently leads the Homeless Ministry.

Gwen has ministered extensively across Southern California in correctional, transitional, and church settings. Her outreach has included Juvenile Hall, McClaren Hall, the California Youth Authority, the Los Angeles Transition Center, and numerous prisons and churches, offering biblical teaching, encouragement, and spiritual support. She has received formal training through Prison Fellowship Ministries and has also volunteered with Christian Outreach in Action (COA), helping feed the homeless—an effort she later expanded through CCC, which now serves the community monthly.

She serves on the Board of Directors of Forgotten Children, Incorporated (FCI), a faith-based nonprofit combating human trafficking and sexual exploitation. Through FCI, Gwen ministers at the Women's Central Regional Detention Facility in Lynwood, California, teaching an eight-week reentry course, *Debunking the Fairytale*, designed to help trafficking victims break cycles of exploitation. A retired tax accountant after 39 years with the U.S. Department of the Treasury, she is a Certified Public Accountant who provides pro bono services to nonprofits and has participated in mission work in Nigeria, Ghana, and Jamaica.

GHAFES is people ... students, Associates, staff and friends of GHAFES with a commitment to reaching the "Tertiary" world with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

GHAFES is the acronym for the Ghana Fellowship of Evangelical Students, a national movement of inter and non-denominational Christian Fellowships in the Universities and other Tertiary Institutions in Ghana.

## Accommodation

1. There are Accommodation-in-charge of the hall of residence for assistance. They are located in the room at the entrance of the hall.
2. Personal effects including toiletries (toothpaste, toothbrush, soap, towel, oils, etc.) are not provided but can be procured from the 'Night' market. You could also ask the porters or the volunteers to direct you.

# Main Exposition



## A Church with Christians That Could Not Be Stopped

### INTRODUCTION: OVERARCHING OBJECTIVES (BIBLICALLY INTERPRETED)

#### 1. Envision, Empower, and Deploy Lifelong Disciple-Makers

FIRESEEDSMAC exists to awaken believers to the normative DNA of the New Testament Church—a Church where every believer is a witness, every disciple is a disciple-maker, and every sphere becomes a mission field.
