

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



It has become increasingly urgent in our present times to proclaim Christ to the world, especially as occurrences across the globe give an indication of the nearness of the Day of the Lord. Day in day out, many Christian missionaries are being persecuted as they take the Gospel to varied people in the world around. It is, therefore, of great joy to see university students and denominational members come together through GHAFES to boldly share the Gospel and fulfil the Great Commission.

This year, the Ghana Fellowship of Evangelical Students (GHAFES), in partnership with the Trinity United Church (TUC), Legon, undertook a three week off-campus missions through the Students in Community Evangelism (SICE) Programme to the less-reached People Groups (UPGs) in Wa and surrounding communities within the Wa Municipality of the Upper West Region.

A total of 36 students and 13 members from Trinity United Church participated, reaching 5,437 people with the Gospel. Out of these, 1,107 accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour, 171 rededicated their lives, and 419 new disciples were raised. Additionally, 30 individuals received the baptism of the Holy Spirit and 2 were baptized in water by the partner denominations. Through the medical outreach, 596 people were screened, providing medication for diagnosed conditions. Missionaries further offered free tuition to over 2,200 pupils across 11 SICE communities, while more than 5,000 individuals benefited from Community Development and Advocacy Programmes. As part of the social interventions, clothing was distributed to over 3,000 people, bringing joy and comfort to many in need.



INTRODUCTION

“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth” – Acts 1:8, NIV.

The scripture above captures Jesus' final instruction to His disciples - and by extension, all who become disciples of Christ - before His ascension. It emphasizes that as believers, we receive empowerment through the Holy Spirit to be effective witnesses of Christ through a clear mission pattern - starting from our immediate environment, extending to nearby regions and ultimately reaching “the ends of the earth.” It is therefore our mandate to preach the Gospel to all groups all around the world to win them to Christ. This is a command to us as true disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ and nothing is more important than this.

Nothing else is worth our time, energy, and resources but the Great Commission's fulfilment.



Some key points worth noting about the uniqueness of the GHAFES SICE:

- It was a mission trip of not less than three weeks.
- The outreach was targeted to the unreached people groups in Ghana.
- Communities reached are followed up for not less than 4 years.
- An average of 5 students/missionaries per community ensured that everyone participated fully and not hide behind others.
- At the SICE programme, the Gospel was preached, pupils were given free tuition, Medical Screening and Community Development and Advocacy Programmes were performed, and Clothes were distributed to ensure Holistic Missions.
- Missionaries lived among the indigenes – slept where the indigenes sleep, ate what they eat and integrated with them fully.

OBJECTIVES



Evangelism and Discipleship

To extend and proclaim the Gospel of Christ to 3,000 people; whilst we pray for 500 people to be convicted by the Holy Spirit to receive Christ as Saviour and Lord and to equip these same ones who come to the faith to be firmly rooted in Christ to reach out to their fellow kinsmen with the gospel.

Health

To offer free medical care to 1,000 people in 4 communities that lack quality health care

Education

To offer free tuition to 2,000 pupils in basic schools.

Community Development through Advocacy

To empower children, youth, and the community through advocacy programmes such as sex education, teenage pregnancy, child labour, the WASH project, etc.

Free Clothes and Educational Materials Distribution

To provide clothing and educational materials for about 1,000 less privileged amongst these communities to give them a comfortable life.

STANDARD OF OPERATION

This year's SICE/Outreach Programme made a tremendous impact in both the lives of the students and members of the Trinity United Church hereby referred to as missionaries and in the lives of the people who were ministered to. Here is the standard of operation followed during the SICE/Outreach Programme.

Planning for the Outreach Programme

Before the SICE/Outreach Programme, there was much planning diligently done by the Missions team and SICE committee, from the Missions desk of GHAFES to ensure that all is well set for the SICE/Outreach Programme. This entails checking with various University calendars to set an appropriate date and deciding on an appropriate venue for the Programme in consultation with missiologists and other mission organizations.

Survey of the Venue

The chosen venue for the outreach Programme was surveyed twice as is normally the practice in the SICE/Outreach Programme. After the survey, **11 communities** were decided on for the SICE/Outreach Programme. During these surveys, the local council of churches in the area, and various denominational leaders were visited and officially informed to ensure the full partnership of the churches. The chiefs and other opinion leaders of all the outreach communities were also informed.

Mobilisation of the Missionaries

The mobilisation of the SICE/Outreach missionaries, was done by sharing a flyer and an attached link to allow students from all our campus fellowships to sign up for the Programme. All those who signed up were put on a common WhatsApp platform for easy communication with all of them.

Training of the Missionaries

Training and orientation of the missionaries was done at the Rev. Paul Adu Memorial Cathedral, Wa, from September 20 to September 23, 2025. Missionaries were taken through various topics such as Strategic Fulani and Wala Ministry, Reaching Out to Muslims, Practical Steps to Disciple-Making and many others, to prepare them adequately for the outreach.

The SICE/Outreach Programme


The main SICE/Outreach Programme in the Upper West Region started on September 24, 2025, after most of the missionaries had been successfully settled in their various communities following the orientation session. For two and a half weeks, the missionaries were with the communities, engaging the people with the gospel using several strategies, including one-on-one evangelism, film-shows, etc

Debriefing

The debriefing was a very crucial part of the SICE/Outreach Programme. All participants were brought together back at the Rev. Paul Adu Memorial Cathedral, Wa, to report on their experience during the outreach Programme. This was done on Thursday, October 9, 2025. A message on re-entry was given to prepare participants to fit back into their local churches back at home.

Coordination

Apart from the various teams that are assigned to various communities, there was a special team put together to coordinate the missions activities in the various communities. The coordinating team visited all teams for at least three times during the mission period. During these visits, they played supervisory roles to ensuring that all was well with the teams, that they lacked nothing and that they were on due course as far as their work in the communities were concerned.



The Follow-up Programme

Follow-up Programme for the outreach/ SICE Programme, if not done, renders the whole Programme fruitless and all efforts put in wasted. The follow up plan is for the GHAFES national service missionaries referred to as STICS personnel to be sent to these communities to do their one-year national service in these communities and make Christlike disciples of all the new believers.

MISSION FIELD COMMUNITIES





PARTICIPATION

The total number of missionaries for this year's SICE was 55; 36 being GHAFES students, 6 GHAFES Staff, and 13 people from the Trinity United Church-Legon. The 55 missionaries were grouped in an average of four people per community. As such they had the opportunity to be well acquainted with the diverse cultures of the varied people groups that were encountered. Each missionary team was hosted by community indigenes throughout the SICE period.





ORIENTATION FOR MISSIONERS

"When Jesus had called the twelve together, He gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick." – Luke 9:1-2



Before the outreach programme was embarked on, all participants were thoroughly trained and equipped in several areas to adequately prepare them for the missions. The orientation session lasted from Saturday, September 20, 2025 to Tuesday, September 23, 2025 at the Rev. Paul Adu Memorial Cathedral, Wa. Some topics treated included;

- **Understanding GHAFES and SICE**
- Evangelising to the Youth
- **The Missionary and His Devotional Life**
- The Role of the Holy Spirit and His Gifts on the Field
- **Child Evangelism**
- Practical Steps to Disciple making
- **Sexuality Issues on the Field**
- Teamwork on the Field
- **Health Issues on the Mission Field**
- Strategic Fulani and Wala Ministry
- **Reaching Out to Muslims**
- Winning the Nations on our Knees
- **Power Evangelism, Anointing and Commissioning Service**



ACTIVITIES

The missionaries, during this year's SICE, employed varied strategies in reaching out to the people in their communities with the Gospel. The various strategies are organized into the following five key indicators; **Evangelism, Discipleship, Education, Medical Screening, and Community Development through Advocacy.**

Evangelism

“Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” – Matthew 28:19

Evangelism was the main drive for embarking on this year's SICE. The missionaries engaged their various communities with the gospel of Jesus Christ by using the following strategies;

- Sports Evangelism
- Video/Movie Evangelism
- House-to-house Evangelism
- Child Evangelism
- Crusades, amongst several others.
- Tract Evangelism
- School Engagement
- Dawn broadcast
- Street Evangelism

By the move of the Holy Spirit, a total number of **5,437 people were exposed to the Gospel, out of which 1,107 surrendered their lives to the Lordship of Jesus Christ and 171 rededicated their lives to Jesus Christ.**

Through these activities, several Muslims were turned for the Lord Jesus giving up Islam, their religion of birth.

Discipleship

“And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.” – 2 Timothy 2:2

In fulfilment of the core mandate of the Great Commission, the missionaries committed much time and efforts to making disciples who will be committed to continuing the good work started by the missionaries within the communities just as the Apostle Paul directed in his letter to Timothy. By God's grace, **419 people availed themselves to be discipled, with 2 of such being water baptised and 30 receiving the baptism of the Holy Spirit.** To ensure continuity, local churches in the areas were partnered in the training sessions. The names and details of the disciples were subsequently given to the leaders of the churches in the communities to continue the follow up. For further continuity strategy, the GHAFES national service personnel, under the **Short-Term Involvement in Community Service (STICS)** Programme, will be sent to these communities to continue with the discipleship process.

■ Education

“To the weak I become weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.” – 1 Corinthians 9:22-23

As part of their work, the missionaries engaged the schools in the communities. They primarily served as teachers and chaplains conducting morning school worship services. Their presence was much of a relief to the school staff because most of these schools were under staffed and with poor infrastructure. In all, a **total of 2,200 pupils received free tuition during the outreach.**



■ Medical Screening

“Nevertheless, I will bring health and healing to it; I will heal my people and will let them enjoy abundant peace and security.” – Jeremiah 33:6

All throughout Scripture, God is seen as a God who is concerned with the health of his children. It is not surprising, therefore, to see Jesus heal several people during his earthly ministry.

The SICE / Outreach Programme in this light organised a free medical screening for an average population of 596 people in 6 communities who had no access to healthcare. Glory be to God for the several people who received free medical care, who also all heard the gospel preached to them as a strategic part of the medical outreach.

Community Development Through Advocacy

Community Development through Advocacy Programmes has been another driving factor in participating in SICE over the years, and this year was no exception. Some of such Programmes included but are not limited to, educational and medical interventions. As a ministry, the focus is to push for development both at the personal and community levels, as part of preaching the Gospel.

Participants of this year's SICE were taken through a training session where they were encouraged to not just preach the gospel but to identify social problems in the communities and bring up initiatives to help solve them to foster development. Key among such initiatives included the following:

Literacy Intervention at Boro

This year, as part of our social intervention works, we identified a dire need in one of the SICE communities called Boro. The community of Boro is inhabited by a total population of about 700 Wala and the Dagati people. This year, during the school engagement, children were seen writing on the bare floor at the Boro Methodist School due to their lack of exercise books. This was heart breaking. By way of intervening, over 200 copies of exercise books, pencils, erasers, sharpeners, and text books were donated by the GHAFES team of missionaries to the school. One could clearly tell from the faces of the headmaster, teachers and students that they were so much filled with joy for this act of kindness.

Free Distribution of Clothes

I needed clothes and you clothed me... The King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" – Matthew 25:36-40

Just as Jesus Christ indicated, providing for the needs of the poor and needy during missions is a core part of proclaiming the Gospel. Prior to the start of SICE/Outreach 2025, clothes were gathered from GHAFES Associates, members of the Trinity United Church-Legon, and friends in order to share to the members of the communities engaged, who may need them. These clothes were distributed to all 11 communities which were subsequently shared to the community folks. The community people were so much grateful for this gesture. Joy was expressed on their faces as they pronounced words of blessings to the missionaries for their acts of kindness. In all, 20 bags of clothing were distributed to over 3,000 community folks.





DEBRIEFING FOR MISSIONARIES

“After a long time, the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them” – Matthew 25:19

Just as it is important to take feedback from any endeavour committed into the hands of another, it was very dire that the missionaries dispatched into the various communities in the Wa Municipality gave feedback about their varied experiences.

The debriefing period has always been a moment of joy with mixed feelings as missionaries reunite after spending weeks apart to share how God had worked through them and more importantly, the souls won for the Lord.

This year's debriefing started with a reporting session, requiring all teams to give a report on the happenings in their various communities. Each team of missionaries took the opportunity to share how they went about their mission, its outcomes and impacts. The missionaries' time together during the debriefing was refreshing but at the same time invigorating and engaging as each team, representing a community, delivered their report. After the reporting session ended, the missions team followed it up with a moment of praises and adoration as the whole team united to give thanks to God with one accord for a successful mission. It was such joy in the presence of the Lord as the team worshipped and prayed throughout the night till the next morning.
