





To reach, equip, and connect tertiary Students and Associates to be effective witnesses of Jesus Christ, serving as agents of change on campuses and beyond.



Thriving Together: The Ongoing Story of GHAFES' 5-Year Journey

The story of GHAFES in 2025 is the story of a movement steadily growing into its God-given mandate.

Entering the third year of the 5-Year Strategic Plan—"Thriving Together: GHAFES Ministry from 2023–2027"—the Fellowship continued its journey under the theme "Thriving Disciples Committed to Scripture" from Philippians 2:12–16.

THRIVING IN WITNESS



UNIVERSITY MISSIONS 2025

The GHAFES 2025 University Missions took the gospel to three campuses—UHAS, Ho Technical University, and Takoradi Technical University—using fresh and engaging approaches such as apologetics lunch bars, evening dialogues, evangelistic Bible studies, QueBees, and “grill a Christian” sessions.

Across both phases, the missions offered a full week of public, persuasive, and consecutive gospel proclamation: June 2–8 in Ho and July 14–20 in Takoradi. Through these creative platforms, entire university communities were intentionally and meaningfully reached with the message of Christ.



FINDING MY WAY BACK: CHRISTABEL'S STORY

With whatever that happened, with the acting and everything, it was life-transforming. I don't even know what to say. It was life-transforming because so far what I know is that I'm back on track. I'm doing what I know I'm supposed to. And then the Sunday service at the NTC, I cleared a lot of perceptions from my head because I got to understand a lot of things about forgiveness, about who Jesus actually is.


SMAC I

The Students Missions Awareness Conference (SMAC), organized triennially by GHAFES, is arguably the largest student missions gathering in Ghana, bringing together students, graduates, faculty, church leaders, and organisations to pray, plan, equip, and mobilise young people for the advancement of the Great Commission.

In preparation, GHAFES staff and students participated in the All-Ministers Conference (AMC), organized with the Lausanne Movement Ghana. With more than 3,000 participants, AMC offered strategic insights into leadership integrity, prayer, intercession, collaboration across denominations, and equipping youth for global missions.



SMAC II



SMAC II 2025 aims to empower students and young people as the next generation of missions leaders, while fostering collaboration among local churches, para-church organizations, and other stakeholders to create a holistic movement for the fulfillment of the Great Commission.

Objectives

Raise Awareness of the Great Commission: To inspire students and graduates with a deeper understanding of the unfinished task of the Great Commission in Ghana and beyond.

Equip and Empower for Missional Living: To provide practical training and exposure that challenge and prepare participants to actively engage in missions as part of their Christian calling.

Mobilize Marketplace and National Service Missionaries: To encourage participants to see their careers and National Service placements as strategic opportunities for evangelism, service, and advancing God's Kingdom.

Facilitate Strategic Partnerships for Greater Impact: To build a collaborative platform that strengthens partnerships among churches, denominations, and para-church organizations for more effective mission work.

STUDENTS IN CHURCH EVANGELISM (SICE) 2025



It is, therefore, of great joy to see university students and denominational members come together through GHAFES to boldly share the Gospel and fulfil the Great Commission.





Thriving in Leadership Development & Mentorship **GHALNETS 2025**

The 2025 GHALNETS camp, themed “Transformed Emerging Leaders Leading a Transformed Ghana”, took place from 3rd–7th November at the Legon Interdenominational Church Room F7, University of Ghana, Legon.

This retreat targeted participants from GHAFES' legal and political networks, equipping and empowering them for Christ-honouring service in their respective fields through plenaries, seminars, workshops, and mentorship.

Recognizing the limitations of traditional pietistic discipleship models, the camp addressed the secular-sacred divide and the leadership gap in national transformation. It provided tailored tools to help emerging leaders apply biblical truths to contemporary societal challenges, enabling them to influence governance, justice, and societal change effectively.

By nurturing tertiary students into Christlike disciples, GHALNETS aims to prepare the next generation of leaders capable of catalysing holistic national transformation.


Highlights from the 8th T. B. Dankwa Memorial Lecture

The 8th T. B. Dankwa Memorial Lecture and Missions Fund lit up Accra and Kumasi with inspiration and purpose in July and August 2025. Held in honour of the late Rev. Dr. Theophilus Bamfo Dankwa, this annual GHAFES event once again brought together leaders, students and mission-minded believers to explore national issues through a godly lens.

This year's speaker, the ever-respected Prof. Kwabena Frimpong Boateng, delivered a compelling and heartfelt lecture, supported by distinguished chairs Prof. Emmanuel Victor Oware Dankwa in Accra and Prof. Mrs. Ibok Oduro in Kumasi.



With the theme "Galamsey – An Ethical, Developmental and Environmental Dilemma: A Godly Response," the lecture boldly tackled the destructive impact of illegal mining. Prof. Kwabena Frimpong Boateng painted a vivid picture of how galamsey harms our environment, health, economy and even our spiritual identity. His simple but powerful reminder—that God entrusted us with only one earth, and caring for it reflects who we are as His image-bearers—left the audience inspired, challenged, and ready to take action.

ACROSS OCEANS, ONE FAMILY: The Birth of the GHAFES Diaspora Network ✨

It began with a simple moment—an excited “Hello, can you hear me?” echoing across screens on March 23, 2025. Faces lit up from Ghana, the U.S., France, and beyond as old friends reconnected and new ones found community. What started as a virtual reunion quickly felt like a homecoming for many living far from home—warm, faith-filled, and deeply refreshing.

From that vibrant beginning, the GHAFES Diaspora Network was officially launched to the glory of God. Its purpose is clear and timely: to strengthen GHAFES’ relationship with associates and partners abroad while creating a supportive, spiritually nourishing fellowship for diasporans. Three global gatherings—held on March 23, July 5, and October 18—drew 48, 42, and 31 participants respectively.

These meetings became lifelines, offering cultural guidance, spiritual encouragement, and practical wisdom for navigating life and faith in foreign environments. From being reminded of Africa’s vital role in the Great Commission, to learning culturally responsive parenting, to gaining boldness in unfamiliar cultures, participants left each gathering empowered, grounded, and grateful for a network that truly understands their journey.


